

We are having another sale; this time for cookbooks and CDs. Our sales usually last a few weeks and sometimes for much longer – it just depends on how many items we have in that category.

We have been getting a lot of donations which we really appreciate. All of the newer books we save to put on the shelves. Sometimes older books, such as classics and histories, are also put out for sale. All books stay on the shelves until sold or until three months go by, but most sell before that time runs out.

Books that are too old or don't sell are sent to ThriftBooks to sell if they can. We also send them rare or unusual books that might have a value beyond our customer range. The online book store can reach a much larger range of customers. For example, we recently got in a six volume set of Ibsen novels in collectible bindings that we sent on to ThriftBooks. You can see their selection by going directly to www.thriftbooks.com or from a link from our website. Of course, they have a much larger source of books than the ones that we send. For the books that we send and they sell, we get a cut of the profit. So this arrangement works out very well for the library.

Back to School: time to explore and use these services the Livermore Library provides:

Pre-school:

- Need something to entertain the young ones while dropping off the older kids? Borrow a children's CD from the library and listen to some kid friendly tunes while heading to school.
- Want to get your youngster hooked on reading and need to find the perfect book? Check out the suggested Preschool and Picture Books information online, http://www.cityoflivermore.net/citygov/lib/kids/books.htm. or drop by the library and ask the children's librarian for suggestions for the perfect book.
- Don't forget the Library of Things which features many items for the younger child that are available for check out. Get your baby/tod-dler into music by checking out the Baby Band Rhythm Set. Or maybe help your child with the

Busy Barn Floor Puzzle (ages 3+). Do some fishing with the Catch and Count Fishing Game Reel! These are only a few examples. Check out the online catalogue (http://www.cityoflivermore.net/citygov/lib/howdoi/find/lot.htm) to see what is available or ask a librarian for a recommendation.

Did you know that the library has free Preschool Classes that run from Sept. 2 to Dec. 20? Babies from birth to 12 months can join the fun in Sing and Learn Babies. Preschoolers, 1 – 5 years can have their own fun in 4,3,2, Fun! and Music and Movement. Ask for more details at the library.

- Check out an audio book or ebook. Some students needing help with reading skills can check out an audio book to listen to while reading a copy of the written book.
- Books24x7 is also available and features technical topics such as computer science and skills, Microsoft office, Android operation systems, Adobe graphics and design, just to name a few.

Need a space for group projects?

The library has you covered with this too. Students can reserve one of the library's study rooms for two hours each day. Ask a librarian for more information!

Need a book for a school assigned genre?

Check out **NoveList Plus;** the link is in the Digital Library under Books/Literature subject. This service is a great tool for self-selecting new books or for looking for book recommendations in school-assigned genres. Student can search for books by grade level too!

Need a personalized recommendation for a book your child (or yourself) would be interested in reading?

Tutor.com Learning Site

The Livermore Public Library has launched a new pilot service that offers students of all ages live one-to-one help from professional tutors online.

- Any community member with a library card can access Tutor.com's Learning Suite from any computer or mobile device connected to the Internet by visiting www.livermorelibrary.net and clicking on Digital Library, then selecting the Academic topic. This will take you to the Academic Subject list. Click on the Tutor.com link.
- The Tutor.com Learning Suite, a service of The Princeton Review, combines on-demand, realtime tutoring with several self-study tools to create a robust, personalized learning or job search experience.
- Tutor.com has a network of over 3,000 professional academic and career tutors who are ready to help both job seekers and students of all ages.
- The self-study tools provide additional modes of support that are available 24/7.



Services include academic tutoring in a wide range of subjects; dropoff reviews of essays, book reports, college applications, and more; SAT and ACT test preparation and job search assistance.

The Friends of the Livermore Library have generously funded the Tutor.com service as a one-year pilot.
