

Future Friends Funded Fun!


From January to May of 2023, the Friends are happy to announce that <u>Livermore</u> Reads Together and Black History Month events are returning as packed full of excitement as ever.

Livermore Reads Together this coming March 2023 will be featuring *Radium Girls: The Dark Story of America's Shining Women* written by Kate Moore. <u>Exploring Dragons with Brian T.N. Gunney</u> Sunday, December 11, 3PM Civic Center Library, Community Rooms A & B



What would happen if you put the familiar cast of medieval fantasies–a dragon, a damsel, and a knight–into the real world, where science and history prevail? That's the question that Lawrence Livermore National Laboratory scientist Brian T.N. Gunney pondered when he wrote the historical fantasy novel Dragon's

Ridge. The book was honored as a finalist in the 2022 American Fiction Awards.

While scientific realism is a frequent goal in science fiction, it's not so common for fantasy, which can rely on "magic" to explain things. But Dragon's Ridge is not so much about the world of magic. The story is shaped by the scientific principles and historical actuality of our world.

To create realistic dragons, the author, who has a Ph.D. in aerospace engineering, worked out the parameters that would make dragon flight possible. He also delved into medieval history to craft an authentic period setting.

In a friendly presentation intended for everyone--from fantasy fans to science buffs--the author will talk about his book and his aerodynamics calculations for dragons. He'll reveal the fascinating insights that science provides and the amusing consequences of trying to cheat Mother Nature. Dragons appear in the mythologies of countless cultures, but you've never seen them quite like this.

Catch your kids up on the last two years of reading! The Friends are sponsoring a Reading Intervention pilot program to support students in grade 1-8 in their reading abilities that have been lost in the difficult last two years. The pilot program will run a trial over the Summer, with the true pilot beginning with the 2023/2024 school year. The Reading Intervention program aims to support students between grade 1-8 improve their reading fluency to at least their grade level.

These volunteers, provided with curriculum materials will be working with the Livermore Joint Unified School District to refer students reading beneath their grade to reduce missed class time. Students entering this pilot program will have already spoken with early literacy specialists to enter this program.
